Clear, not as cold overnight, starting temp was over 40F, and was 65F by 1pm. Wind did pick up to 5-10 in gusts, but it was generally still. Little bird movement observed. Banded birds are not indicated in totals, an x indicates a bird captured but not detected. Delaina LeBlanc from BTNEP, Katy from Woodlands, Kristina Crouch from Tulane, and David Fox from the US Park Service Barataria Preserve were the other participants. A total of 21 birds were captured, including one CARW that was previously banded one year ago and not seen since.
